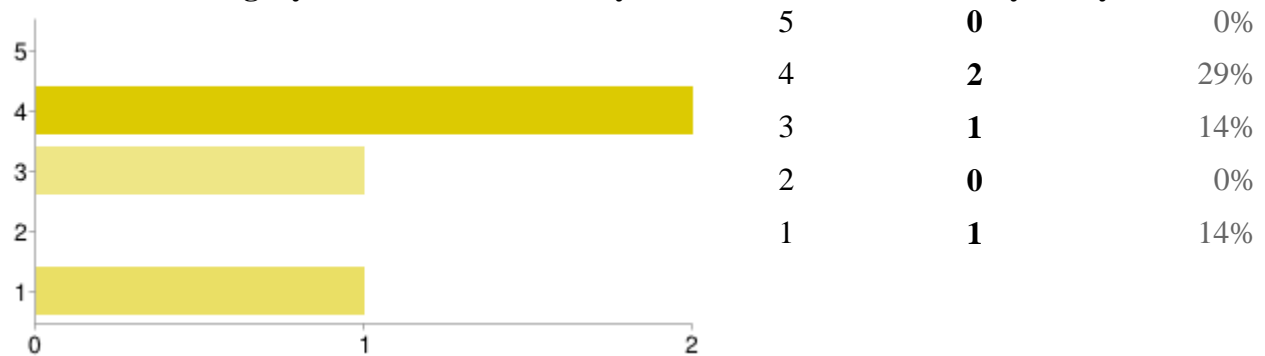
Rate the following layouts based on which layout has the best functionality. - Layout #1



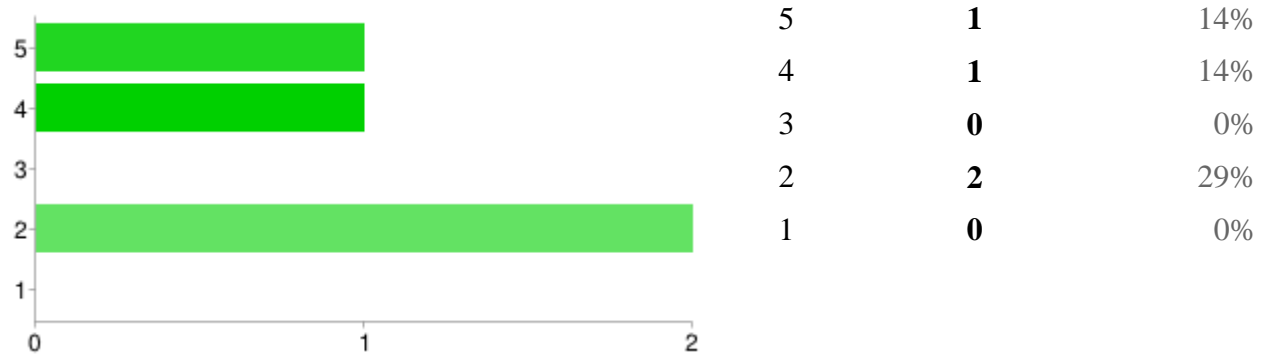
Rate the following layouts based on which layout has the best functionality. - Layout #2



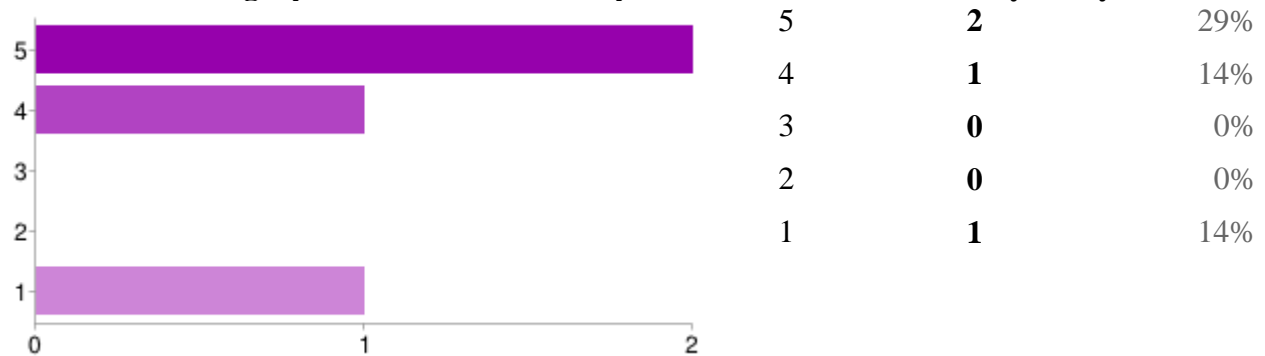

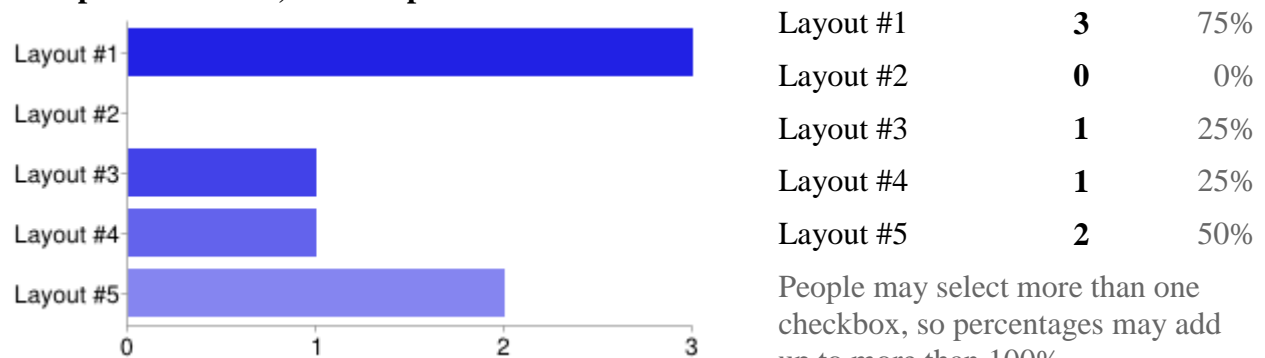

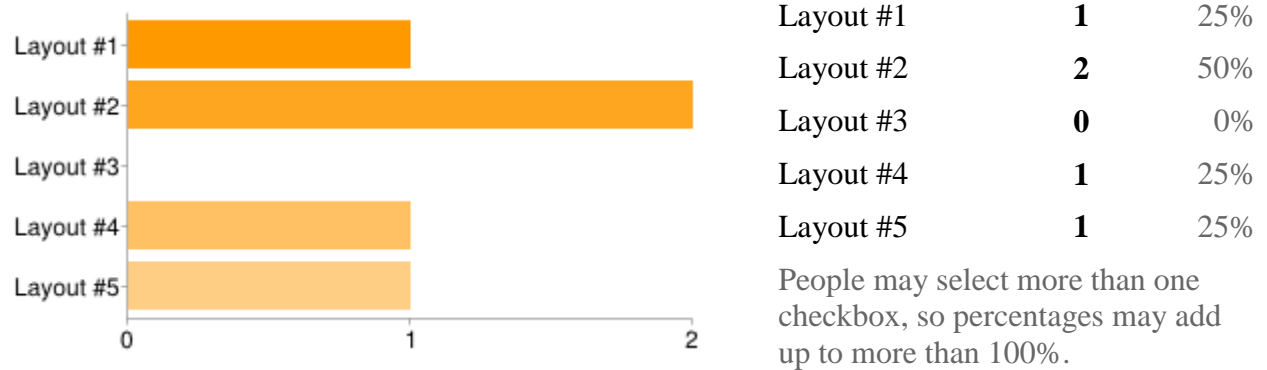
